diers now awaiting Court Martial sitting.

The Military had confirmed that all CRW soldiers involved in the attempted November 2, 2000 mutiny had been charged and would be appearing before the Court Martial.

Manu Samoa ready for Fiji

A CONFIDENT Manu Samoa team arrived into the country yesterday all ready to battle with the national Vodafone Fiji side.

Who is Mr Navin Naidu?

THE legal fraternity is confused over the legal representative for rebel leader George Speight and brother James Speight in the treason committal proceedings at the Suva Magistrates Court.

Speight told Chief Magistrate Salesi Temo at the preliminary inquiry yesterday that Navin Naidu of the United States of America will represent him.

The announcement comes in the wake of the withdrawal of Rabo Matebalavu as his lawyer.

However, when contacted yesterday, members of the Fiji Law Society along with law

firms and the Director of Public Prosecutions office claimed they have never heard of Naidu.

A source at the DPP's office said yesterday that they were trying to find out who Mr Naidu was and whether he was a Citizen of Fiji or the US.

"What we know at the moment is that he is a Fiji citizen and has practised law in Fiji," the DPP source said.

According to US Embassy public relations officer, Nirmai Singh, Naidu is a US citizen but he was unaware of further details on him.

"This is all I know because the US is a very big country and I can't confirm whether he exists or not nor can I release information about him," Mr Singh said.

Veteran Suva lawyer Gyaneshwar Prasad Lala claimed yesterday that "we've never heard of him."

"If he does come in the country to represent Speight then he will be first required to register himself under the Fiji bar which is the case for all practising lawyers in the country," said Mr G P Lala.

"But if he is registered in

Britain or some commonwealth country then it shouldn't be a problem as he will be allowed to practise law here."

Magistrate Temo adjourned the proceedings to Monday of the following week to give Speight time to liaise and consult with his new attorney.

"To give George and James Speight a fair trial I'll have to adjourn the matter to a later date and I expect them to come prepared to cross examine the first witness on Monday," Magistrate Temo

said. The reasons for withdrawal of Mr Matebalavu as Speight's lawyer were a conflict of interest and "a need for Speight to seek second consultation in the proceedings."

Mr Matebalavu's replacement, Naidu will be arriving in the country today but a confirmation on his time of arrival was not given yesterday by Speight.

Appearing in court yesterday under a single treason charge containing 13 "overt acts" were George Speight, Ratu Timoci Silatolu, Josefa Nata, Ilisoni Ligairi, Joseva Savua, James Speight, Iliasa Duvuloco, Peceli Vuniwa and Apenisa Rovutiqica along with four others.
